

Revere, Apr. 10th. 1882.

My dear sister:

We reached here from Washington after a very pleasant journey, on last Saturday morning. On the afternoon of the same day we went out to Concord where we had a delightful time with the Wheelers. We got back here this noon and to-morrow afternoon we start for Winterport.

It is our present intention to leave there in season that we may get back here on Saturday next. Early in the next week we shall come

to S. I. and shall spend a few days also in Brockton. The week or ten days previous to my departure I must spend at the "old home".
