

Amburst, Apr. 22d, 1889

My dear sister:

Your postal was received a day or two ago. I was delighted to know that you find yourself better and hope we may soon welcome you here. Let Sam come out with you by all means, if he can.

Am sorry that I did not let him know of my contemplated visit to you: but it did not occur to me that he would want to come down, and even had I thought so, our coming was so uncertain up to the very last moment that I should hardly have dared to have written.

You will be sorry to hear that Sue's husband has passed away. He died one week ago yesterday. Eva and I went to the funeral which was in St. Johnsbury last Wednesday, travelling all Tuesday night going up and Weds. night coming back, getting here at about nine o'clock

in the morning. Mr. & Mrs. Hull, Alf and
his wife and a number of Revere people
attended. Dr. Si and family got home
Thursday night of week before last, and
Friday night upon getting a telegram
from Sue the Dr. went up and was
with her at the end. She went to Re-
vere with father and mother; we hope
she will come here before long. Si will
not remain here permanently, though that
was in consideration when he was urged
by our father to come. He thinks he has a
better chance west. Cousin Annie's ^(Durham) bizzie
who was visiting in Northampton came
over Saturday and goes back this after-
noon. She is very pleasant -
